



A Report of workshop on Awareness Programme on Incubation & Start-ups

A Faculty Development programme on "A Report of workshop on Awareness Programme on Incubation & Start-ups" was held from 25 Sept 2016 to 26 Sept 2016 at PEC, where the Faculty of Engineering and Management Sciences were present. Objective of entrepreneurship conducted in the premises of an academic institution and aims at creating awareness among students about various facets of entrepreneurship while highlighting the merits of pursuing such a career option. The Government of India's 'Start-up India' scheme has the India Aspiration Fund which has the right to disburse Rs 2,500 crores per year, with a total corpus of Rs 10,000 crores across four years.
